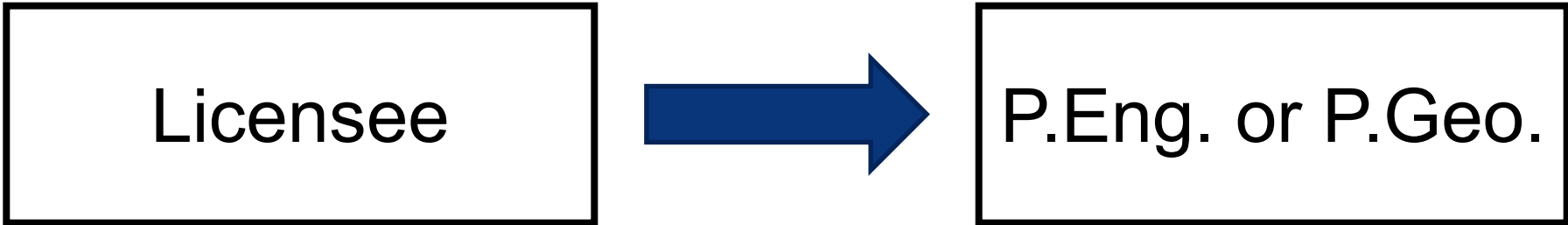

Licensee



Current legislation

- Also commonly known as Foreign Licensee.
- Licensees have the same qualifications as a P.Eng.s or P.Geo.s but do not have Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status.
- Licensees have the same practice scope and obligations as P.Eng.s or P.Geo.s, but they don't have the right to vote or run for Council.



Proposed Change

- Licensee designation should be eliminated so that qualified individuals may be registered as Professional Members (P.Eng.s or P.Geo.s), regardless of Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status.

Rationale

- The designation Licensee does not fully describe to the public what the individual can practice.
- If qualified to independently practice, then they should be able to register as Professional Members (P.Eng.s or P.Geo.s).
