Court decision reconfirms fairness of APEGA's application process

Edmonton – The Alberta Court of Appeal has dismissed Ladislav Mihaly's application to appeal a Court of Queen's Bench ruling from last January that reversed a 2014 Alberta Human Rights Commission (AHRC) tribunal decision against APEGA.

"We're pleased that this file has been concluded. It reconfirms that APEGA's application process is fair, equitable, and transparent, and serves the public interest," said APEGA Registrar Carol Moen, P.Eng. "Regardless of where applicants for licensure studied, the same rigorous standards apply. Lowering the standards used to examine if an individual has appropriate education and experience to be licensed would result in an unacceptable increased risk to Albertans."

Established in 1920, APEGA regulates the practices of engineering and geoscience to serve the public interest in Alberta.
