President

Brian Pearce, P.Eng. (one-year term)

Brian Pearce, a professional engineer, has been an APEGA member for more than 30 years. He graduated from the University of Alberta with a bachelor of science degree in agricultural engineering in 1986 and started working at Stewart, Weir & Co. (now Opus Stewart Weir), at which he worked his way up from various positions, including site inspector, design engineer and engineering manager.

In 2006, Pearce became vice-president of engineering at the company and oversaw multidisciplinary teams involved in civil, environmental and geotechnical engineering, along with surveying, historical resources and land acquisition. He moved from chief business officer to chief executive officer before being named president, leading the company's transition to the global corporation it is today.

An APEGA councillor from 2012–2014, Pearce also served as APEGA council vice-president in 2014–2015. He volunteered as a member of the APEGA Nominating Committee from 2015–2016, where he worked as part of a team to select the best possible potential candidates for election to APEGA council.

Pearce retired from full-time engineering consulting in 2016. In January 2017, he began assisting the First Nations in Western Canada with project completions as a part-time corporate lead for the Canadian Indigenous Collaborative. He was also a board member of the Peerless Trout First Nation Development Corporation in 2019.
