DESCRIPTION

This award will honour and recognize students who demonstrate exceptional leadership qualities within the engineering and geoscience university student communities in Alberta.

VALUE
\$1,000

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for the award, a student must be enrolled in an engineering, geology or geophysics undergraduate or graduate degree program in Alberta. Graduate students must also be either a member-in-training **or** applicant with APEGA.

AWARDS

Up to eight (8) awards are available.

NOMINATIONS

Nominations may be self-nominations or submitted by peers, professors, or others within the university community.

CRITERIA

Award recipients will be students who can demonstrate that they have achieved the following criteria within the last two years:

- Participated in planning career or personal development activities for university students, relevant to engineering or geoscience
- Volunteered at student events
- Provided impact/value by improving the reputation of the engineering or geoscience profession beyond the faculties (e.g., university-wide or community-wide)
- Demonstrated leadership skills by motivating and inspiring the people around them to accomplish more than they would have normally
- Actively shared responsibility, authority, information and credit when working towards the achievement of a goal
- Taken prompt decisive action to resolve issues quickly and effectively
- Set a high standard of integrity by leading through example and maintaining high personal standards
- Effected positive change while in a leadership role.

REQUIREMENTS

Complete the nomination form in full and attach documents describing the nominee and his/her achievements which, in the opinion of the nominator, qualify the nominee for the award, together with such supporting evidence as the nominator may wish the Selection Committee to consider. Submissions must include **a minimum of two reference letters** (nominee will be responsible for obtaining and submitting the letters), including contact information for each reference. References must be **professional** references who are in a leadership position, not peers. References must be able to comment on the nominee's leadership abilities. Submissions must also include proof of enrolment (official university documentation) in an engineering or geoscience degree program. Incomplete nominations will not be considered.
