**TAKE FURTHER NOTICE** that pursuant to *EGP Act – Part 5 – Section 56*, the aforementioned persons may appear and be represented by Legal Counsel at the preliminary application before the APEGA Discipline Committee.

**TAKE FURTHER NOTICE** that pursuant to the *EGP Act – Part 5 – Section 58(1)*, that evidence may be given before the APEGA Discipline Committee in any manner that the Committee considers appropriate, and the Committee is not bound by the rules of law respecting evidence applicable to judicial proceedings.

**TAKE FURTHER NOTICE** that pursuant to the *EGP Act – Part 5 – Section 61(3)*, that the Discipline Committee, on proof of service of the notice of investigation on the investigated person and the complainant, if any, may

- (a) proceed with the investigation in the absence of either or both of these persons, and
- (b) act on the matter being investigated in the same way as though either or both of those persons were in attendance.
